

Volunteer Role Description - In-Patient Unit Assistant

Arthur Rank Hospice is committed to inclusivity, respect, fairness, engagement and equality of opportunity for our patients and their families, our staff and trustees, our volunteers and our supporters. Role Title: In-Patient Unit (IPU) Volunteer

Aim: To provide volunteer cover on the IPU by supporting the staff to serve

refreshments and meals to patients and their visitors

Reporting to: Health Care Assistant/ Shift Coordinator/ Housekeeper

Will this role require a DBS check? Yes, standard

Is there a minimum age requirement for this role? Yes, age 17 with

parental/guardian consent if under 18.

Shift: Either breakfast (8-11), lunch (11-2) or dinner (5-8). Shifts can be weekly, fortnightly or on an ad-hoc basis on our IPU Volunteer Bank.

About the ward (In-patient Unit, IPU):

We have 23 beds available with 8 single rooms and a 4-bedded bed in each wing. Each room and shared bay has en-suite facilities and accessible gardens. Usually 60% of our beds are dedicated to patients with complex end of life care needs and 40% are nurse-led beds, to help relieve pressure at our local NHS hospital, Addenbrooke's. Due to the current situation with coronavirus and in response to government guidance we are currently able to provide care to patients in 19 beds.

Main Responsibilities

Meal times and refreshments

- Assist staff to serve meals to patients including taking menu orders (where needed) and distributing meals to patients
- Offer drinks and snacks for patients in accordance with their dietary requirements and needs
- Change patients' water jugs each shift
- Take dirty plates and cups after patients have finished eating to the main kitchen
- Collect any clean cups and cutlery from the main kitchen to stock the IPU

Tidiness

- Help to maintain a clear and tidy environment on the IPU
- Tidy linen store, ensure fresh linen is available in rooms and bays
- Remove rubbish and dirty laundry on the ward
- Assist staff to prepare beds

Other responsibilities

- Assist the IPU by running errands e.g. fetching newspapers for patients
- Be aware of the IPU lounge and encourage patients and families to use it where appropriate e.g. as a place to have meals, read, watch TV
- Stocking the IPU lounge, kitchenette, and visitors' suites and keep it clean and tidy
- Be aware of the Visitors' Kitchen and encourage visitors to make use of the facilities
- Provide a welcoming and supportive environment for patients and their visitors

General Responsibilities

- Telephone the Hospice as soon as possible if unable to fulfil your commitment so that replacement cover can be arranged
- Maintain strict confidentiality at all times
- Be sympathetic to, and be able to project the philosophy and concept of the Hospice
- Attend or contribute to volunteer meetings whenever possible
- To adhere to the Volunteer policies and procedures including health & safety and information governance

- An opportunity to be part of a professional team and contribute to a very worthwhile cause

- Training and induction relevant to the role
