Shifts: Tuesdays/Thursdays – furniture deliveries and collections* **Monday/Wednesday/Friday** – distribution of stock to shops and Hospice

Main Responsibilities

- Accompany the van driver on his rounds, collecting and dropping off excess stock and donations at our 5 charity shops.
- Assist the driver to collect and deliver furniture to and from customers' houses. **This might include heavy lifting on Tuesdays and Thursdays.** *
- Help to load/unload the stock into and from the van.
- To help with directions and finding a parking space.

General Responsibilities

- Telephone/email the Retail Hub manager as soon as possible if unable to fulfil your commitment so that replacement cover can be arranged.
- Adhering to all Retail policies and procedures.
- Maintain strict confidentiality at all times.
- Be sympathetic to and be able to project the philosophy and concept of the Hospice.
- To adhere to the volunteer policies and procedures including Health & Safety.
