## **Patient's experience**

A patient's experience of music therapy was shared with Trustees at our June Board meeting. Music therapy is one of the additional services we provide that can help people deal with all that they are facing. In this case, the therapist helped an elderly patient re-find her singing voice and compose a song filled with love for her husband and a celebration of the

history they shared.

It was incredibly moving to be able to hear her sing with the support of the therapist and to read the poignant lyrics she had written for him.

It is important that we always listen to a patient's story at each meeting. This keeps us focused on why we are here as a charity and what a difference we can make with compassionate and tailored services. It was doubly important in a meeting that focused on our ability to fundraise and generate enough income to make sure we can continue to provide the services, such as music therapy, which are paid for directly by the charity and not commissioned by the NHS.

## **Community support and income**

As a Board, we recognise and are so grateful for the support we get from our community in so many different ways. Every donation and legacy and every bit of sponsorship and fundraising matters to us and our patients. We could not do all we do without that bedrock of support.
